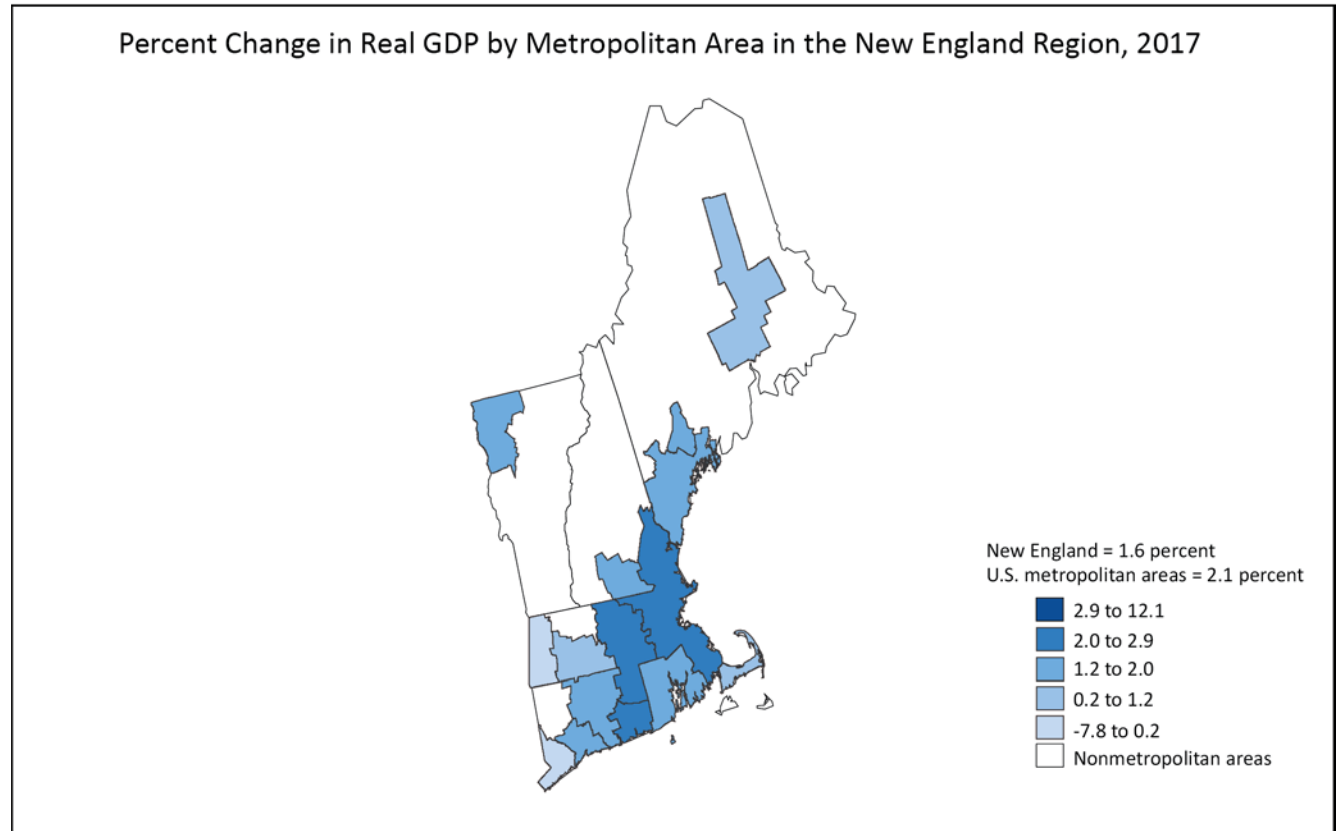


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by Metropolitan Area, 2017

- Real GDP increased in 13 of the 15 MSAs wholly contained in this region. Growth in real GDP ranged from 2.8 percent to -3.0 percent.
- Boston-Cambridge-Newton—the largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 9th largest in the nation—increased 2.8 percent due to growth in professional and business services. Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk, CT—the 2nd largest metropolitan area in the region, and the 38th largest in the nation—declined 3.0 percent due to a decrease in finance, insurance, real estate, rental, and leasing.
- Per capita real GDP in the MSAs wholly contained in this region ranged from \$87,082 in Bridgeport-Stamford-Norwalk, CT to \$33,640 in Lewiston-Auburn, ME.
